This means to me that as aging continues to claim us, we are not all alone and there is always someone who cares. I am so glad that the congregation will remain our church even after I retire.

Isaiah 46:4 carries a promise: "...even when you turn gray I will carry you. I have made and I will bear; I will carry and I will save." Thank you gracious God that we can look in the mirror and know that you care and that you provide others who care for us too.
